We created Minted to be a fun and safe platform for users and contributors to interact, explore and discover new NFTs.

This Code of Conduct is intended as a framework for all who visit and use the services on Minted to nurture an open, welcoming, diverse, inclusive and healthy community for anyone and everyone.

We want to foster a fair and transparent platform for all our members, including our Minted team, who may participate in drops but will not be given special privileges or advantages and are precluded from using any material non-public information for their personal benefit, advantage or purposes on Minted.

We will also take appropriate and fair corrective action in response to any behaviour or content which we deem inappropriate, threatening, offensive, or harmful, including issuing warnings and suspending/banning accounts, and will remove, edit, or reject any content that is not aligned with this Code of Conduct.

As a community member and/or contributor of Minted, here's what you can / can't do:

Please do:

1. Express yourself, share and exhibit your work. Explore your creative freedom!
2. Treat others as you would treat yourself. Be respectful of differing opinions, viewpoints and experiences.
3. Give credit where credit is due. Pay royalties where royalties are due.
4. Respect copyright and intellectual property rights according to the creator's licence.
5. Keep the Minted community safe and a harassment-free experience for all. Report any content which violates these guidelines.

Please do not:

1. Create, display or share NFTs which promote suicide or self-harm, spread or incite hate or violence, endorse terrorism, hate groups or criminal behaviour, or include profanity or graphic language or overtly sexual content.
2. Create, display or share NFTs which degrade other persons or brands, or misrepresent another person's or brand's involvement.
3. Mint someone else's work as NFTs without their prior knowledge and express permission, or mint NFTs that infringe on the personal rights of other individuals, including intellectual property rights.
4. Impersonate another person, commit identity theft, or dox other persons or publish another's private information, such as a physical or email address or personal images, without their explicit permission.
5. Do anything illegal, fraudulent, unethical or hateful.
